As a result, a percentage of every membership of FW will go towards funding a quality education for Indigenous girls.

One of the women to benefit from the program, Libby Cook-Black, said the scholarship she received through AIEF had taught her to take hold of every opportunity.

"It will probably change your life and put you in a place that you never expected for yourself," she said.
